What's special about San Antonio?

The answer is as varied as the people who live in and visit San Antonio.

Long a crossroads of history (and a meeting place of cultures), San Antonio is a rich blend of deeply rooted traditions and 21st century cosmopolitan flair, a place where America's past and present merge to create a unique vibrancy. Now the nation's eighth largest city, San Antonio is a joyful mélange of the flavors and sounds of Native Americans, Old México, the Republic of Texas, Germans, the Wild West, African Americans, and the Deep South.

Native Americans first lived along the San Antonio River, calling the area "Yanaguana," which means "refreshing waters" or "clear waters." A band of Spanish explorers and missionaries came upon the river in 1691, and because it was the feast day of St. Anthony, they named the river "San Antonio." The actual founding of the city came in 1718 by Father Antonio Olivares when he established Mission San Antonio de Valero, which became permanently etched in the annals of history in 1836 as The Alamo, where 189 defenders held the old mission against some 4,000 Mexican troops for 13 days. The cry "Remember the Alamo" became the rallying point of the Texan revolution against México. Located in the heart of downtown, today The Alamo is a shrine and museum.

For many visitors, San Antonio is the Paseo del Rio, an urban masterpiece. Better known as the "River Walk," these cobblestone and flagstone paths border both sides of the San Antonio River, 20 feet below street level, as it winds its way through the middle of the business district. Stretching for approximately two and a half miles, the River Walk has multiple personalities – quiet and park-like in some stretches, while other areas are full of activity with European-style sidewalk cafes, specialty boutiques, art galleries, nightclubs and gleaming high-rise hotels.

Come experience San Antonio – her natural beauty, her history, her people, her music, and her cuisine. You'll leave with memories to last a lifetime. TOUR 1: CELEBRATING SAN ANTONIO!

We begin the day in one of the most beautiful neighborhoods in all of Texas, King William Historic District. Developed in the late 1800s by prosperous German merchants, the homes showcase ornately carved wood, delicately scrolled ironwork and beautiful landscaping. Next is the centuries old hub of our city, San Fernando Cathedral. The art and history inside the sacred walls are immense and include gifts from the world over. Our last stop is the border-style El Mercado or Mexican Market. Once the center for all commerce, the market has retained much of its charm and is filled with quaint shops which offer local crafts, art, clothing and food.

Next is the quaint German community of Fredericksburg, settled in the 1840s by large numbers of German immigrants. It is like taking a trip to Old World Germany! Main Street is lined with more than 100 specialty shops offering everything from fine antiques and apparel to unique gifts and home interiors. Fredericksburg is also home to the Admiral Chester Nimitz Museum of the Pacific War for the non-shoppers.

The new winery replaces an original 19th century German stone barn and stands beside the circa 1880 log cabin, water well, and milk house recreating the appearance of the original farmstead.

A stop for lunch on your own will be made in Fredericksburg where it is like stepping into Old World Germany. Its wide historic Main Street is lined with more than 100 specialty shops and a variety of restaurants to choose from.

TOUR 19: UNEARTHING SECRET TREASURES
